Holiday Trash Schedule & Information

- * **Please see calendar below for trash pickup days and Christmas Tree Pick up.**
- * The Yard Waste Program will resume on March 3rd. Remember not to put trash in your brown can.
- * **Please make sure to always have your cans out by 6 a.m.**
- * Please do **not** put your Christmas trees in your green waste cans. Put them off to the side with **ALL** ornaments, tinsel, and other decorations removed.
- * If you miss the Christmas Tree pickup, you can put your trees out on your extra trash day (the 3rd trash day of the month).
- * Back by popular demand! EXTRA EXTRA trash is coming the week **between** Christmas and New Years. Bundle or bag your extra trash and place 3 feet from your cans by 6:00 a.m. on your scheduled trash day. We will take care of the rest!
- * Please have 3 feet between each can and other obstacles where possible. Our trash trucks need a bit more room to avoid knocking cans over or causing property damage.

SIDE NOTE:

- **Keep the sidewalk in front of your property clear.** Shovel the snow into your yard and enjoy the benefits in the spring after it melts!
- **Do not shovel the snow into the street.** This inhibits proper drainage and can cause a *big* mess.
- Remember that the Town will only plow the streets if there is accumulation of at least 4" on the ground with a projection of more to come within the next twelve hours.
